Farm Workers Choose Familias Unidas to Bargain with Sakuma Bro.s

In the September issue of the newsletter, Marketing & Membership Director Cassie Blom reported that Sakuma Brothers, suppliers of berries to Driscoll's, had agreed to an election process where the workers would choose their bargaining representative. That election was held and the 500 Triqui, Mixteco and Spanish-speaking workers elected Familias Unidas por La Justicia (FUJ) to represent them in contract negotiations with Sakuma Brothers. As a board member, I am grateful to the Co-op members who made us aware of the situation and the members who supported the boycott. Volunteer to Survey Synthetic Fragrances at the Co-

At the September meeting of the Member Action Committee, Patty Clary

from Californians for Alternatives to Toxics spoke about Multiple Chemical Sensitivity (MCS), which affects about 16% of people. I have experienced immediate discomfort from synthetic fragrances and perhaps you have, too. These synthetic substances are made with petrochemicals.

At the Co-op, we want to protect our customers and our employees who have MCS. According to Patty's presentation, some of the worst offenders that induce an allergic reaction are in the laundry and cleaning products sections. At the meeting, it was agreed that a survey of laundry and cleaning products to check for synthetic fragrances would be a good starting place to evaluate how products in our

stores may be affecting those with MCS. Along with the survey, we would like to research safe alternatives to synthetics and bring these to people's attention.

We need some member volunteers to help with this project. If you would like to be part of this project, leave your contact information at Customer Service at either store. The MAC meets on the second Wednesday of the month at 6pm in the Ten Pin Building, Arcata. Your participation will be most welcome.



Delicata Squash Taços

featuring Delicata Squash from Warren Creek Farms

Delicata squash is known for its delicate rind and creamy flavor. Although the rind is soft enough to eat, this variety holds it shape very well making it a great choice for stuffing. Consumed as a mature squash it is considered a winter variety, although it is relative to summer squash staples such as pattypan, zucchini and yellow crookneck. This versatile squash tastes great sweet or savory, and boasts a healthy amount of fiber, vitamins A and C, and potassium.

Ingredients:

1 delicata squash, small to medium size

- 1 small white onion
- 1 small red onion
- 1 teaspoon white sugar
- 1 avocado

1 teaspoon oil to coat pan 2 limes' juice +1 limes zest 6 corn or flour tortillas Queso fresco to garnish Cilantro to taste

Seasoning Mix:

1/2 teaspoon cayenne powder

- ½ teaspoon chipotle powder
- ½ teaspoon curry powder
- ½ teaspoon smoked paprika
- ½ teaspoon pepper
- 1 teaspoon salt

Directions:

- 1. Cut delicata lengthwise, remove seeds and peel off outer skin
- **2.** Slice halves into $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick slices
- 3. Cut white onion in half and slice into thin strips
- 4. Cut red onion into strips and slice 1 lime in half
- **5.** Toss red onion with white sugar and the juice from 1 lime in bowl and set aside.
- 6. Toss squash and white onion in seasoning mix and set aside

- 7. Heat cast iron or large frying pan and 1 teaspoon oil to medium high
- **8.** Add squash and white onion and fry on medium heat until squash is fork tender and browned
- **9.** Zest lime and squeeze juice from one half directly into pan with squash and onion
- 10. Slice avocado and mince cilantro for garnish
- 11. Heat small corn tortillas and build your tacos
- 12. Serve with queso fresco (optional)

Annual Membership Meeting Recap

Saturday, October 22, 2016, North Coast Co-op held its Annual Membership Meeting at Azalea Hall in McKinleyville. Unlike previous years, the Annual Membership Meeting was held before the end of this year's election, allowing for members to meet the candidates and engage in conversation regarding some of the proposed bylaw changes.

The day started with a warm reception, where more than 60 members enjoyed a variety of food and drinks upon arrival. While snacking on delicious food provided by the North Coast Co-op Deli, members had the opportunity to speak with board members about the proposed bylaw changes and proposed transition to a single-person membership. Board candidates were also present to meet members and answer questions. Member-owner Howdy Emerson graced Azalea Hall with his Celtic Harp music.

At 3:30, emcee and member-owner Roger asked attendees to take a seat as he introduced the day's agenda. After the board approved the 2015 Annual Member-

ship Meeting minutes, Roger introduced board candidates Mary Ella Anderson and Robert Donovan. Each spoke a bit about themselves, and Mary Ella mentioned that there is also a write-in candidate, Suzanne Stafford.

All members received an entry to the raffle upon arriving at the meeting, and five raffle prizes were given out throughout the day. The prizes included a variety of reusable containers and bags, as well as some staff favorites from the grocery shelves.

Cheri Strong, Board Vice Chair, gave the Board Chair report on Fiscal Year 2016 (FY16). Dave Feral, Board Chair, was tending to his family's booth at the Arcata Farmers' Market, and was unable to be present in time to deliver the report. Cheri touched on some key accomplishments from FY16, as well as some of the board's more recent actions. She also noted that the board highly values moving forward with strength and unity, and is excited to continue working cooperatively with staff and members. A copy of her report can be found in this year's Annual Report.

Roger then introduced new General Manager Melanie Bettenhausen. Melanie pointed out that the Co-op has been in a period of transition, largely due to internal hiring practices—Melanie herself has been working at the Co-op for over nine years, and stepped out of her former role as Marketing & Membership Director to accept the General Manager position. She gave a highlight of the Co-op's achievements over the past ten weeks. She thanked the Outreach staff for their organization of the Annual Membership Meeting, the Management Team for their support and leadership, and the entire Co-op staff for their

hard work and dedication to the community.

Melanie highlighted the positive sales growth seen in FY16, and touched on the operational accomplishments seen that year. These highlights, and more, can be found in her article in this year's Annual

The member comment period was full of positive and respectful discourse. Member-owners brought many different opinions about the proposed transition to single-person memberships to light. Some members felt it was an important transition, while others purported that it would not be functional in real life. One member suggested that the board look into having both individual and family membership

Other topics that members discussed were the proposed bylaw changes, concern about packaging waste, member engagement, and employees' ability to communicate about the value of membership. New Membership Coordinator Nicole Chase introduced herself, and helped facilitate the member comment period.

After the open mic, attendees enjoyed a baked potato bar with all the fixings, salad, and dessert options provided by Beck's Bakery and Arise Bakery. Member-owners stayed after dinner to mingle with each other, the board, and staff members. Thanks to John Shelter and his group at New Directions, event setup and cleanup was especially efficient and smooth.

The event concluded at 6:00pm, with connection, communication, and community lingering in the air. We look forward to another year of productivity and service, and hope to see you all next year!


Demos Galore
